To the Honorable William Paca Esquire Judge
of the District Court for the Maryland District —
Humbly Complainin^g sheweth unto your Honor your
Libellant Richard Puller of Baltimore County Mariner that
he on or about the fourth Day August Twente Hundred
and Eighty nine on the High Seas and within the Juris-
diction of this Court to wit at the Port of Baltimore did
Enter and shipp himself on Board a certain Ship called
the Juliana Commaned by John Kemp Captain and
Master and now lying at Anchor in the Port of Balti-
more to perform a voyage in the Capacity of a Sailor at
the rate of three pounds ~~Current~~ Money per Month which
said voyage was to Commence from the said Port of Balti-
more to Buman thence to Baltimore again As by the Ship-
ing Articles of Agreement herewith produced Resune being
shewt to had will more fully appear

And your Libellant further sheweth that he hath in the
Capacity of Sailor on Board the said Brigantine Acted
and performed the Duties of his Station for the term of
Eight Months and that the wages justly due and owing
unto him therefor amount to the Sum of twenty four
pounds Current Money of Maryland —

Your Libellant further sheweth that the aforesaid stipula-
ted voyage from Baltimore to Buman and thence Back to
Baltimore hath been performed and that therefor in Vir-
tue of the said Articles of Agreement he is justly and
truly Entitled to have and Receive his wages amount-
ing as aforesaid to the Sum of twenty four pounds Current

Money of Maryland —

Your Libellants further sheweth that he has frequently requested the said John Kemp Master and also the Owner of the said Brigantine for the aforesaid wages due unto him who always refused paying the same

Your Libellants further sheweth that the Owner of the said Brigantine cannot now be found by your Libellants and your Libellants hath reason to believe that he has absconded with a view to evade the payment of this and other claims against him

Your Libellants further sheweth that he cannot obtain relief but by the Interposition of this Honorable Court

Your Libellants therefore prayeth your Honor that an Attachment may be issued against the said Brigantine called the Juliana her Tackle Apparel and Furniture and that the same may by the Decree of this Honorable Court be sold for the payment of the wages due as aforesaid unto your Libellants and so forth
