To the Honorable William Paca Esquire Judge of  
the District Court for the Maryland District

Humbly Complainin<sup>g</sup> sheweth unto your Honor your  
Libellant John Dargen of Talbot County Blacksmith  
that on or about the twentieth day of July in the year Seven  
teen Hundred and eighty nine on the High Seas and  
within the jurisdiction of this Court to wit at the  
Port of Baltimore he was hired and employed by  
John Kemp master and commander of the Bri-  
gantine called the Juliana now lying at anchor  
in the said Port of Baltimore to repair and amend  
the said Brigantine her Tackle Apparel and Fur-  
niture; And your <sup>Libellant</sup> saith at the special instance and re-  
quest of the said John Kemp as aforesaid and upon  
the credit of the said Brigantine and without any  
knowledge of the Owners, he did in a faithful and work-  
manlike manner repair and amend the said Brig-  
antine her Tackle, Apparel and Furniture and did  
also then and there find and provide divers materials  
and necessary things used in and about the said  
work, as by a particular list of herewith produced  
reference being thereto had will more fully appear.  
And your Libellant saith that for the work and re-  
pairs done and performed by him as aforesaid in  
and upon the said Brigantine and for the Divers  
materials and necessary things used in and about  
the said Work he reasonably deserves to have and  
receive the sum of ten pounds fourteen shillings  
and nine pence current money of Maryland.  
And your Libellant further sheweth that he has  
frequently applied to and requested the said John  
Kemp master to pay and satisfy him for the



above mentioned work and materials and that the said  
John Kemp has invariably informed him that he is  
altogether unable to pay the same. And your Libel-  
lant further saith that he is otherwise informed and  
has reason to believe that the said John Kemp is  
insolvent. And your Libellant further saith that  
the real owner of the said Brigantine Juliana is  
not known to him and that the reputed owner can  
not now be found by your Libellant. And your Li-  
bellant further saith that he is informed and has  
reason to believe that the said reputed owner has  
absconded with a view to evade the payment of  
and other claims against him.

Your Libellant further sheweth that he can-  
not obtain relief in the premises but by the interpo-  
sition of this Honorable court, and therefore prayeth  
your Honours that an attachment may be issued  
against the said Brigantine Juliana her Tackle  
Apparel and Furniture and that the same may  
by the decree of this Honorable Court be sold for  
the payment of the above mentioned sum of ten  
pounds fourteen shillings and nine pence, due  
as aforesaid unto your Libellant and so forth.
