To the Honorable William Paia, Esquire,
Judge of the District Court for the Maryland
District—

Humbly Complaining sheweth unto your Honor
Your ^{Libellant} James Beays of Baltimore County Shipcarpenter
that on or about the second Day of August in the year
Seventeen Hundred and Eighty Nine on the High Seas
and within the Jurisdiction of this Court to wit
at the Port of Baltimore, he was hired and Employed
by John Kemp Master and Commander of the Brigantine
Called the Juliana, now riding at Anchor in
the said Port of Baltimore to repair and Amend
the said Brigantine her Tackle Apparel and Furni-
ture; And your Libellant's faith at the special
Instance and Request of the said John Kemp as
aforesaid and upon the Credit of the said Brigantine
and without any Knowledge of the Owners he did
in a faithful and Workmanlike Manner, repair
and Amend the said Brigantine, Her Tackle Appa-
rel and Furniture and did also then and there find
and Provide Divers Materials and necessary things
used in and about the said Work as by a particular
Account thereof herewith produced reference being there
to had will more fully Apppear. And your Libell-
lant's faith that for the work and repairs done and

Performed, by him, as aforesaid, in and upon the said
Brigantine, and for the Divers Materials and necessary
things used in and about the said work he reasonably
Desires to Have, and receive, the Sum of Eleven pounds three
Shillings Current Money of Maryland.

And your Libellant further sheweth that he has frequent-
ly Applied and requested, the said John Kemp Master
to pay and satisfy him for the above mentioned work
and Materials and that the said John Kemp has inva-
riably informed him, that he is altogether unable to pay
the same.

And your Libellant further saith that he is otherwise
informed, and has reason to believe, that the said John
Kemp is insolvent - And your Libellant further saith
that the Real Owner of the said Brigantine Juliana
is not known to him and that the reputed Owner
cannot now be found by your Libellant And your
Libellant further saith that he is informed, and has
reason to believe, that the said reputed Owner has
Absconded with a view to evade the payment of
this and other Claims against him -

Your Libellant further sheweth that he cannot ob-
tain relief in the Premises but by the Interposition
of this Honorable Court and therefore prayeth your
Honor that an Attachment may be issued against

the said Brigantine Juliana her Tackle Apparel and
Furniture And that the same may by the Decree of
this Honorable Court be sold for the payment of the
above mentioned Sum of Eleven pounds three Shillings
due as aforesaid unto your Libellant and so forth —
