to bring into your Honourable Court  
the body of the said William F. Bruscup,  
he having enlisted in said Company  
A in violation of the wishes and  
without the consent of your petitioner.

To Capt Manly of the Southern District - Greeting  
You are hereby enjoined and  
Commanded to be and appear  
before the Circuit Court of the  
United States for the fifth  
Circuit in and for the Maryland  
District, at the United States  
Court Room in the Masonic Hall in the City of  
Baltimore on to morrow (Friday) Morning at 10  
Clock A.M. and that you have with you the  
body of William J. Bruseup, a Minor of the age  
of sixteen years on the seventh day of last August,  
enlisted in Company A of the Second Maryland  
Regiment, and is now imprisoned in the Southern  
District Watchhouse for Baltimore City, and  
is there illegally held as a deserter from said  
Company A. Now in your custody. And that  
you certify and make known the day and cause  
of the capture and detention of the said William J.  
Bruseup and that you then and there do submit  
to and receive whatsoever the said Court shall de-  
termine upon concerning you in this behalf accor-  
ding to law, and have you then and there this  
writ.

Justice of our Supreme Court the first Monday  
in December in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and sixty one.
